



Position: Mental Health Provider, PRN

Location: Cullowhee and Franklin, with limited telehealth and extensive outreach in the 8 western NC counties

Compensation: Competitive, Commensurate with experience

Organization Description: Vecinos is a non-profit, 501(c)3 Free Clinic that provides out-patient and mobile integrated primary and mental health care, health education, and case management to uninsured Latinx adults in the far-western NC counties.

Mission: Our mission is to provide culturally-appropriate health and wellness services for the uninsured Latinx community.

Purpose: The Mental Health Provider serves the mental health needs of uninsured Latinx adults with a strong focus on preventive care and holistic wellness. This person attends mobile and static clinics and conducts limited telehealth on a PRN basis throughout the year. The Mental Health Provider works closely with the Mental Health Program Assistant and outreach workers to ensure patient care, resource connections across the region, and continuity of care. The ideal candidate is flexible, open to working in a changing environment, and has the desire to serve uninsured/underserved populations, specifically agricultural workers.

Responsibilities:

- 1) Mental Health Therapy
 - Perform mental health assessments
 - Develop and implement person-centered plans and work with outreach staff to complete needed follow up
 - Provide ongoing follow up, management, and referrals as appropriate
 - Recommend further treatments as appropriate
- 2) Administrative
 - Complete required documentation
 - Maintain licensure and credential requirements for the state of North Carolina
 - Work towards clinical performance measures
- 3) Community Engagement
 - Precept and supervise volunteers and interns, as needed
 - Assist the team in building professional/medical connections and expanding/maintaining care network for patients in Western NC

Required Qualifications

- Native, or near-native, fluency in English and Spanish
- Licensed as a mental health therapist in North Carolina.
- Able to work effectively as a team member and work closely with nurses, physicians, outreach staff, and other partners
- Cultural sensitivity, a caring and confident demeanor, flexibility, dependability, excellent written and verbal communication skills, high energy-level, willingness to work in a nontraditional/non-clinical setting, a professional attitude, desire to serve uninsured/underserved populations

- Working knowledge of farmworker-specific mental health issues
